

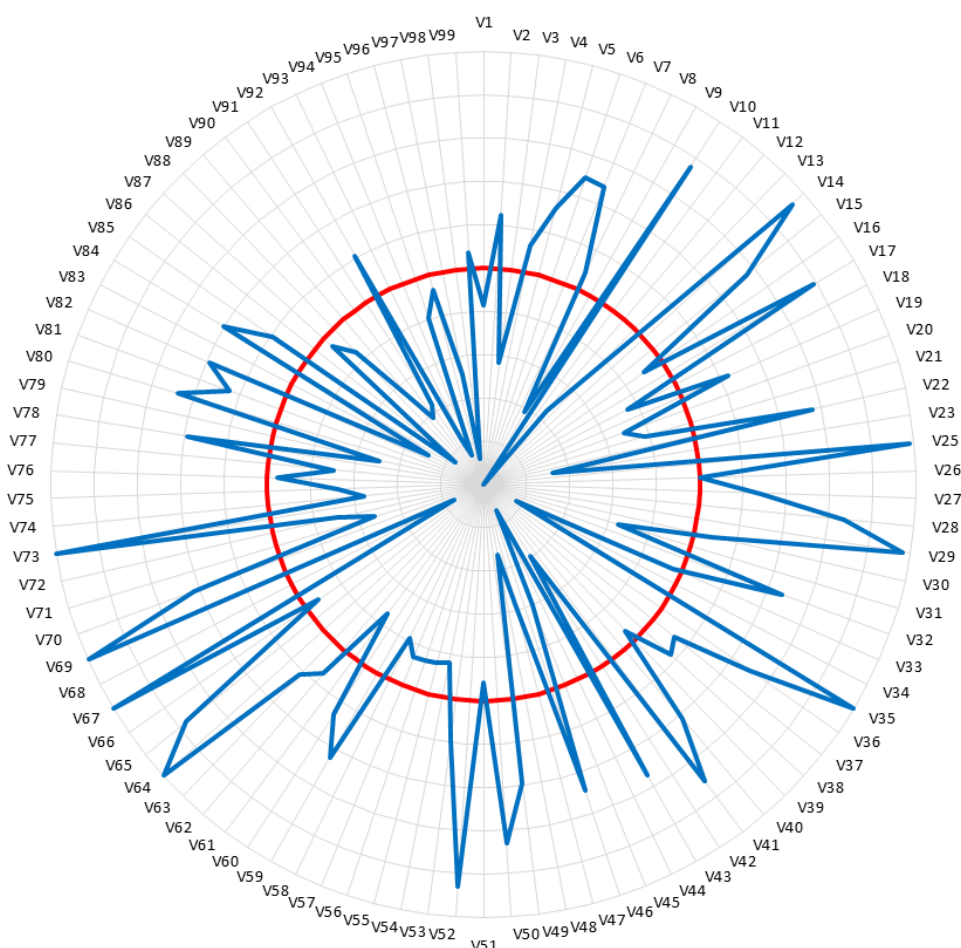
Crowded Outer Suburbia (Group 12)

The members of this Group are mainly concentrated along the north-western outskirts of London, with the majority of neighbourhoods adjacent from Barnet and Harrow, as well as single neighbourhoods from Brent and Hillingdon. A single neighbourhood from Redbridge completes the group. According to the 2011 London Output Area (OA) Classification, this group consists of key OA classifications of Settled Asians (43% of OAs), Multi-Ethnic Suburbs (16%), London Life-Cycle (15%), and Ageing City Fringe (13%).  - Persons working in wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motor cycles sectors
 - Population
 - GCSE scores
 - Authorised absence in schools
 - Households deficient to access to public open space
 - Area that is domestic gardens



Radar chart showing range-standardised differences of each variable from the grouping mean (red line).

Outer values show a level far higher than the London group average and Inner values show a level far lower than the London group average.

1. For a variable to be 'far below average' it must have a difference of more than 70% below the London mean (red line).
 2. For a variable to be 'close to the average' it must have a difference less than 5% either above or below the London mean.
 3. For a variable to be 'far above average' it must have a difference of more than 70% above the London mean.
