

Central Affluence (Group 2)

The members of this Group are all adjacent neighbourhoods in the centre of London, containing both of the Kensington & Chelsea neighbourhoods, as well as two of the four from Westminster. According to the 2011 London Output Area (OA) Classification, this group consists of key OA classifications of Urban Elites (62% of OAs), High-Density & High-Rise Flats (18%), and London Life-Cycle (15%).

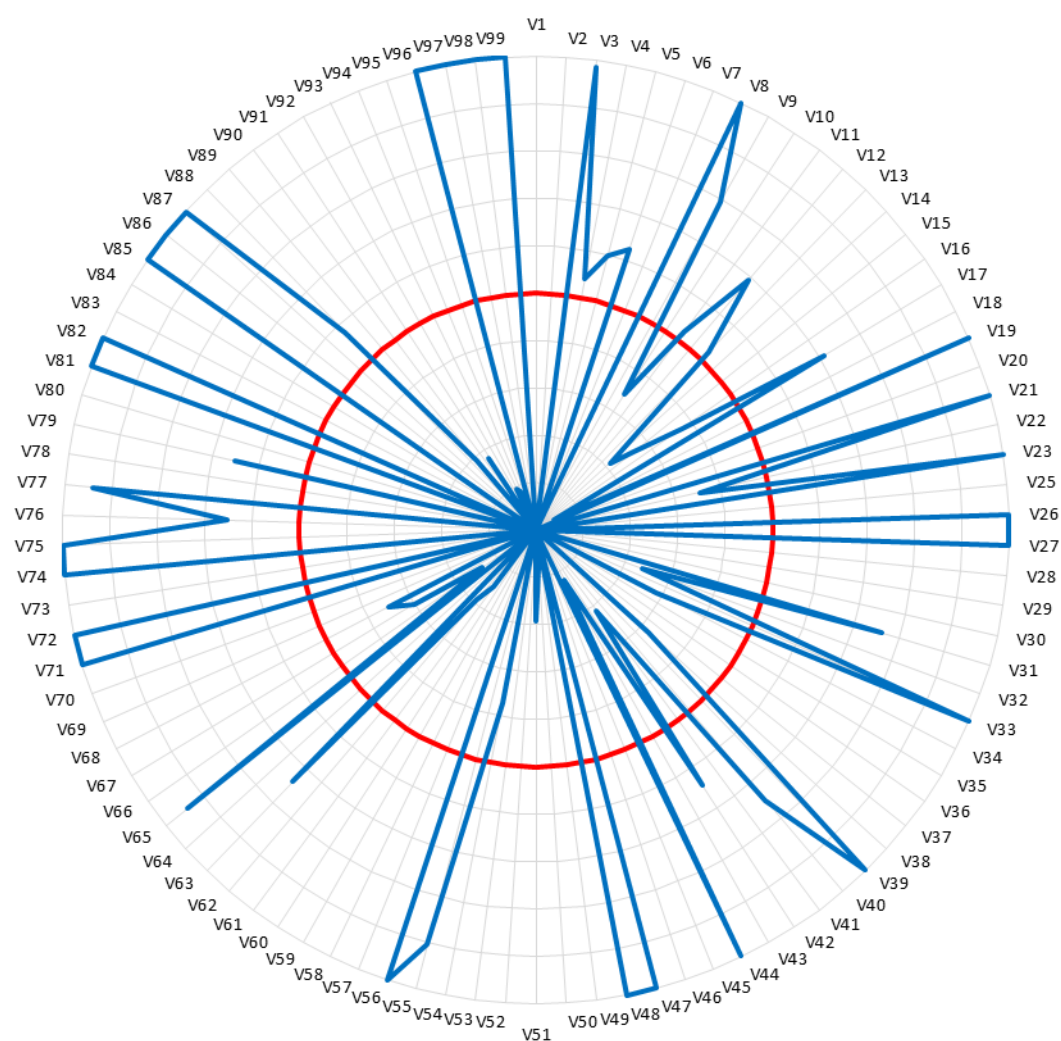

Outer values show a level far higher than the London group average and inner values show a level far lower than the London group average.

2. For a variable to be 'close to the average' it must have a difference less than 5% either above or below the group mean.
3. For a variable to be 'far above average' it must have a difference of more than 70% above the group mean.
