Green City Fringe (Group 9)

The members of this Group are spread around the outskirts of the eastern half of London, with few adjacent neighbourhoods. In the north, neighbourhoods from Enfield and Waltham Forest are included, with three from Barking & Dagenham and Havering in the north-east. Single neighbourhoods from Greenwich, Croydon and Sutton complete the members of the Group. According to the 2011 London Output Area (OA) Classification, this group consists of key OA classifications of Intermediate Lifestyles (56% of OAs), and Ageing City Fringe (25%). In this


